23	JURISDICTION AND VENUE		
24	1. This Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331, which grants		
25	the district courts "original jurisdiction of all civil actions arising under the Constitution		
	laws, or treaties of the United States."		
26	2. Venue in this Court is proper under 28 U	.S.C. § 1391(e).	
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## **PARTIES**

- 3. Plaintiff Eugene Davidovich is an individual residing in San Diego County.
- 4. Plaintiff Davina Lynch is an individual residing in San Diego County.
- 5. Plaintiff John Kenney is an individual residing in San Diego County.
- 6. Defendant City of San Diego is a political subdivision of the State of California.

## FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION (INJUNCTIVE RELIEF)

- 7. The foregoing paragraphs are realleged and herein incorporated by reference.
- 8. San Diego Municipal Code section 54.0110 provides as follows:

## § 54.0110 Unauthorized Enchroachments Prohibited

It is unlawful for any *person* to erect, place, allow to remain, construct, establish, plant, or maintain any vegetation or object on any public street, alley, sidewalk, highway, or other public property or public right-of-way, except as otherwise provided by this Code.

(Added 10-18-2007 by O-19670 N.S.; effective 11-17-2007)

- 9. On information or belief, the legislative history of this ordinance is that it was enacted to prevent encroachment of dumpsters in alleyways.
- 10. On or about \_\_\_\_\_\_, the San Diego Police Department placed large plastic barricades filled with water across all entrances to Civic Center Plaza except for a narrow three foot passageway.
- 11. Lt. \_\_\_\_\_\_ informed Plaintiff DAVINA LYNCH as the barricades were being placed that their purpose was to control access to Civic Center Plaza and make it easy to inform anyone entering that they cannot place any object down, pursuant to SDMC section 54.0110.
- 12. The police sometimes choose to enforce this ordinance very strictly, requiring that no one entering Civic Center Plaza place any object on the ground, particularly when members of Occupy San Diego enter the Plaza. On other occasions or with respect to other individuals, the police allow objects to be placed on the ground.
- 13. Section 54.0110 is void for vagueness in that it does not define a criminal offense with sufficient certainty so that ordinary people can understand what conduct is prohibited,

and it encourages arbitrary and discriminatory enforcement. The ordinance fails to establish standards for the police and public that are sufficient to guard against the arbitrary deprivation of liberty interests and fails to give fair notice of what acts will be punished so that First Amendment rights are chilled.

- 14. Section 54.0110 is overbroad because it has a chilling effect on free expression in that individuals are often not permitted to place protest signs down even next to where they are standing. The ordinance also sweeps unnecessarily broadly and thereby invades areas of protected freedoms.
- 15. Plaintiffs have no adequate remedy at law for the injuries currently being suffered and for the injuries that are threatened, in that the injury to their First Amendment rights cannot be remedied by damages and that the quantification of such damages will be impossible to determine. Further, unless enjoined, the Plaintiffs will be forced to institute a multiplicity of suits, because the wrongful conduct by Defendant and its agents is of a repeating and continuing nature.

## SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION (DECLARATORY RELIEF)

- 1. The foregoing paragraphs are realleged and herein incorporated by reference.
- 2. An actual and concrete dispute now exists as to the rights and duties of Plaintiffs and Defendants herein, and Plaintiffs seek a declaration of the duties and obligations of Defendant and its agents. Plaintiffs seek a declaration that SDMC section 54.0110 is void for vagueness and overbreadth.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs pray for judgments against Defendant as follows:

- 1. For a temporary restraining order, a preliminary injunction, and a permanent injunction, prohibiting Defendant and its agents or employees from enforcing SDMC section 54.0110;
- 2. For a declaration by the Court of the rights and duties of Plaintiffs and Defendant herein;
- 4. For reasonable attorney's fees according to proof;

1	5. For costs of suit herein incurred; and	
2	6. For such other and further relief as the court may deem proper.
